this book outlines the contributions school counselors and others make to the development and college and career readiness of each student at the elementary middle and high school levels

college readiness rates across the nation and in florida are bleak about a third of 2019 florida high school graduates taking the act or sat met college readiness benchmarks act incorporated 2019 college board 2019 almost 70 of those students many unprepared may have chosen to attend college florida department of education 2020 these unprepared students are less likely to graduate

college in six years and may not even earn a college degree when 2016 florida attempted to address college readiness with a series of policy changes the policies began with high schools voluntarily offering college readiness preparation in 2008 and shifted to a rigid policy in 2011 requiring high schools to administer a college readiness test and enroll students not meeting established test benchmarks in state developed college readiness courses florida legislators reversed course in 2015 eliminating the mandated college readiness testing and courses with all the policy changes it is important to understand how high schools are preparing students for college the purpose of this study was to examine the college readiness approaches in one florida school district in this comparative case study twelve school administrators and counselors across six high schools explained postsecondary preparation at their school the college readiness framework developed by conley 2014 informed this study this framework breaks down college readiness into four components cognitive strategies content knowledge learning skills and techniques and transitional knowledge and skills the framework provided a mechanism to compare the college readiness approaches described by participants in this study to the research based college readiness approaches outlined by conley 2014 as essential to postsecondary success the framework also allowed for the comparison of approaches described by participants across schools this study also explored the college readiness policy beliefs of participants given the frequent policy changes the findings revealed college readiness approaches varied across schools with each school using a unique approach all schools used testing to determine if students were college ready and offered numerous advanced and college level course options to high achieving students meeting graduation requirements was critical across the schools as participants focused on the fact that a high school diploma would allow students to attend an open access state college in florida the student in the academic middle received less attention as schools focused preparation efforts on students at risk of not meeting graduation requirements and advanced students when comparing the college readiness approaches described by conley s college readiness framework

findings revealed gaps in preparation efforts specifically in the areas of cognitive strategies and learning skills and techniques participants presumed teachers delivered content knowledge but they could not explain how students used or connected information schools also struggled with the cultural and personal aspects of college readiness such as how to socially transition to college and build self advocacy skills every school offered students college admission and financial aid information with two schools providing every twelfth grade student with the opportunity to complete the state financial aid application when examining the policy attitudes of high school administrators and counselors findings revealed principals desired increased control at the school level some participants were concerned schools may not identify and prepare potential college going students in the absence of a college readiness policy

roughly one third of all u s high school graduates do not enroll in college soon after earning a diploma there are many reasons why students do not do so including work obligations affordability concerns and lack of academic preparation yet research suggests that many of these students often aspire to a college education helping these students turn aspiration into action is a policy priority for states one important factor in successful transitions for high school to college is demonstration of college readiness traditionally measured by course seat time however as one strategy to enhance student transitions from high school to college statewide and system wide admission policies are beginning to assess college readiness through multiple measures this education trends report reviews these multiple measures provides a deeper look at competency based assessments and offers policy considerations for state and system leaders key takeaways include 1 at least 18 states have complete or partial alignment between high school graduation course requirements and statewide or system wide admission standards 2 instead of completing coursework a growing number of states allow high school students to pass competency based assessments to demonstrate mastery of subject content and 3 state k 12 and higher education leaders should continue to work closely and explore and evaluate more effective measures to gauge students college readiness and chances of success

the developmental strategies for college readiness and success resource guide was produced by the education commission of the states and the southern regional education board for the countdown to 2015 developmental strategies to advance readiness in the common core era convening held april 21 23 2014 in charlotte north carolina the meeting was the culmination of a project between the community college research center complete college america education commission of the states education first and the southern regional education board the meeting brought together 10 state teams consisting of policy leaders and k 12 and higher

education officials committed to improving college readiness for all students the overarching goal was to help states develop action plans to ensure that significantly more students are prepared for postsecondary education complete entry level college courses and persist toward credential completion this challenge will become even more apparent in 2015 when the results of the first full administration of new assessments aligned to the common core state standards are released the resource guide summarizes information about developmental models research and examples of state policies and institutional practices the guide is designed to help policymakers and postsecondary leaders and practitioners identify and implement strategies that will improve college readiness and completion in their states
